

## **Frequently Asked Questions**

### **Q: What is a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan?**

**A: A site-specific document that we compile for you which includes the following:**

- Best Management Practices, e.g., silt fences, berms etc., employed to control contaminated storm water runoff
- Subcontractor agreement sheets guaranteeing responsibility for SWPPP compliance (OPTIONAL)
- County Historical Information
- Site plan showing the site area and sediment controls
- Inspector Certifications
- State Regulations - copy of the General Permit 150000.
- Local Regulations - design Criteria for proper BMP installation

### **Q: Why do I need a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan?**

**A: It is required by Local, State and Federal Environmental Agencies.**

### **Q: When do I need a Storm Water Pollution Plan?**

**A: When your site is 1 acre or more.**

### **Q: What is a Notice of Intent (NOI)?**

**A: An NOI is a state application for a permit to discharge to surface waters near a construction site.**

### **Q: When do I need a Notice of Intent?**

**A: When your site is 5 acres or more or part of a larger development plan, e.g., a subdivision.**

### **Q: What is a Notice of Termination (NOT)?**

**A: An NOT is a form to officially notify the state that you will no longer be discharging to surface waters. It is submitted when the construction site is at 70% stabilization.**
